

Layered Roman Shade contains:

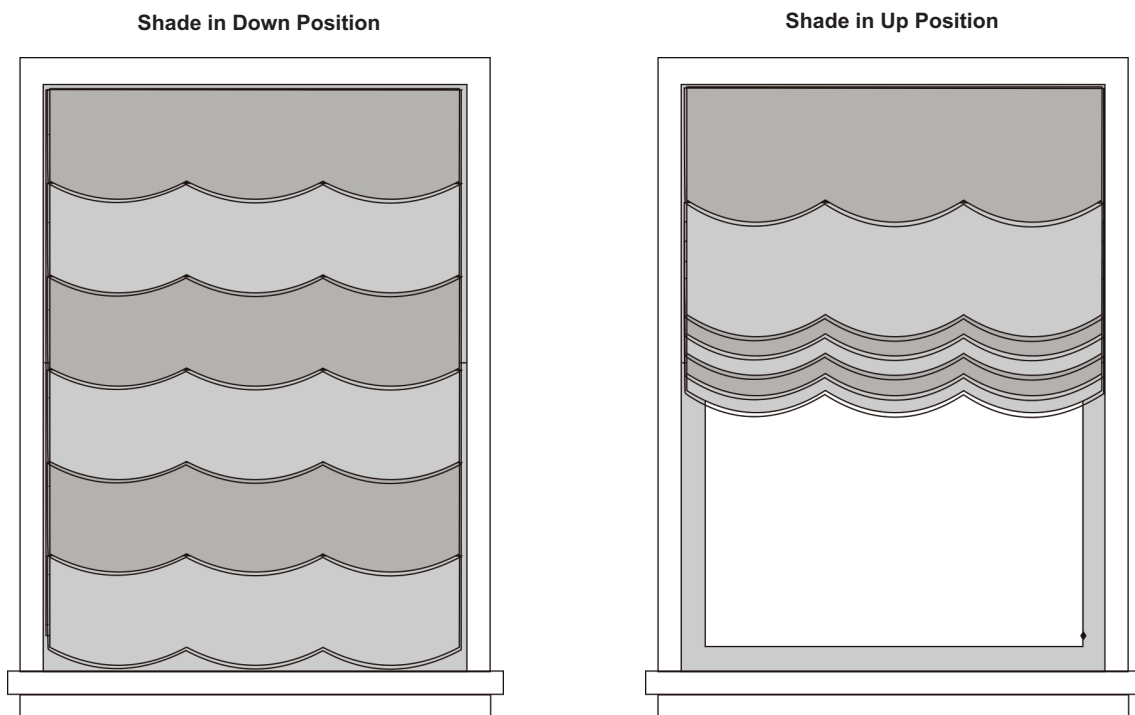
- Instructions to make a layered roman shade. This shade features overlapping layers, which can be constructed out of coordinating fabrics. The shade can have a scalloped or shaped bottom edge. Use the templates provided or create your own shape with a 2" or less difference between the high and low points. The templates provided fit shades up to 48" wide.

Suggested Fabrics: Light to medium weight drapery fabrics, such as cottons, silks, velvets, chenilles, polyesters.

Yardages: Shades up to 48" wide: Cuts 15" long or vertical repeat (whichever is greater) for each layer, of both lining and face fabric. Additional lining the finished length of the shade plus 7". Fabric for microcord (see inside).

Supplies: Microcord - $\frac{1}{8}$ ", cordlock, shade cord, cord drop, rings, shade ribs or dowels, $\frac{1}{16}$ " aluminum weight bar, 1 x 2" lumber, round screw eyes, soft shade spacers, L brackets and screws for installation.
